## **CCS TIE BREAKER POLICIES**

(Revised: 11/77, 5/98,10/99)

### **FOOTBALL**

The ten-yard line tie breaker system, recommended in the National Federation Football Rule Book will be used in all rounds of the Section Play-offs.

### **SOFTBALL**

The ASA softball tie breaker may only be used during pre-season contests and league-season contests if approved by the respective league and/or tournament. It will be used during the CCS Playoffs

### **BASEBALL:**

#### **➤ CCS Playoffs– Game Ending Procedures**

1. CCS Playoff games will be considered "suspended" games if it is necessary to call the game due to weather, darkness, tournament scheduling, site curfew or other unanticipated extenuating circumstances prior to the completion of five full innings as outlined in NF Rule 4-2-2. These "suspended" games will be continued from the point of suspension and will be scheduled to resume as soon as possible.
2. CCS Playoff games called due to extenuating circumstances after a full five inning has been completed shall be considered regulation unless the game is tied. These games shall be continued from the point the game was called and shall be scheduled to resume as soon as possible

#### **➤ League Options for Game Ending Procedures**

1. As allowed in NF Rule 4-2-4, each league may establish game ending procedures for tied games that are called after the completion of five full innings or any innings or portion of innings thereafter, as a result of weather, darkness or other extenuating circumstances as allowed in National Federation Rules, 4-2-4. (e.g. rather than replaying the entire game, leagues could establish a policy that would make this a suspended game which would be resumed at the point the game was called)
2. As allowed in NF Rule 4-2-4 each league may establish game-ending procedures for games that are called prior to the completion of five full innings as allowed in NF Rules 4-2-4. (e.g. rather than replaying a game in its entirety after it is called due to darkness in the top of the third inning, the league may establish procedures to suspend that game and resume play later from the point the game was called)
3. Leagues who choose not to adopt specific game ending procedures will be bound by the National Federation Rule Book
