Vanessa Bergman (Pinewood). Brigham Young University diver was the NCAA 1-meter board champion in 1994.

Ed Berry (Carlmont). College and pro defensive lineman who has been inducted into the Peninsula Sports Hall of Fame.

Dann Bilardello (Marello Prep). Catcher in the National League for eight seasons between 1983 and 1992.

Denise Bilbaeno (South San Francisco). UC Davis All-America volleyball player was member of the 1990 NCAA Div. 2 champs.

Pam Bileck (Pioneer). Member of 1984 USA Silver Medalist Olympic Team, she has been inducted into the U. S. Gymnastics Hall of Fame.

Nancy Case (Leland). Nancy was a player on Sonoma State University's NCAA Div. 2 National Women's Soccer Championship Team.

Chris Cavanaugh (Lynbrook). Won an Olympic swimming gold medal in 1984 with the USA relay team.

Paul Cayard (Crestmoor). Skipper of USA yacht that won round-the-world title in 1992. Member of Sailing World Hall of Fame.
