COMMENTS:**I. TOURNAMENT GUIDE CHANGES—UPDATES FOR NEXT YEAR**

Report accepted by the CCS Board of Managers meeting on April 13, 2011. That acceptance provided for all the Tournament Guide changes contained in this report for the 2012 season.

IV. PROPOSED MAJOR FORMAT CHANGES

Proposal #1 and Proposal #2 were approved by the CCS Board of Managers meeting on October 19, 2011.

Wrestling Proposal #1**VI A 3 b**

This proposal will help codify the past practice which has been used for the past 10 years to determine qualifiers into the CCS Tournament from the leagues. This proposal also addresses how any extra allocations would be dispersed and a process if there are not enough allocations per formula.

Section 4. QUALIFICATION OF INDIVIDUALS

A. The top 29 individuals, and alternates in order of Varsity League finish, in each weight-class from each League qualify to enter a 32-place bracket, as follows:

In each weight class that a wrestler from The King's Academy qualifies, the SCVAL will be allowed one additional entry.

B. Entry Procedure:

1. The number of entries per League, per weight-class, is determined by the respective percentage of CCS Tournament medalists over the past two [2] years. **This percentage is determined in the following manner:**

- Total the two year medal count for each league**
- Divide that number of medals by the total amount of medals available over a two (2) year period, in this case 168 medals**
- Multiply that number by 29 (number of wrestlers in each weight class) to determine a two (2) year percentage.**

2. No League will qualify less than two [2] entries per weight class, *and* no league will receive more than six (6) entries per weight class.

3. Additional entries are allocated, in order, to the top-ranked Leagues **Entries will be allocated accordingly,** to fill the bracket to 29 of the 32 places;

- Leagues with a > 6.0 % will receive 6 entries per weight class**
- Leagues with a 5-5.9 % will receive 5 entries per weight class**
- Leagues with a 4-4.9 % will receive 4 entries per weight class**
- Leagues with a 3-3.9% will receive 3 entries per weight class**
- Leagues with < 3.0 % will receive 2 entries per weight class**

If there is any remaining entries to be allocated, it shall be allocated to the league with the highest percentage between 2.0-2.99. If no league is within those percentages the next league between 3.0-3.99 will receive the extra allocation. If no league is within those percentages the next league between 4.0-4.99 will receive the extra allocation. If no league is within those percentages the next league between 5.0-5.99 will receive the extra allocation.

PAST PRACTICE**NEW LANGUAGE**

If there are not enough allocations (29 wrestlers per weight class) as allowed by the formula the lowest percentage league within the 6.0 and greater range will lose a qualifier-when multiple leagues are in that range. If no leagues are within those percentages the next league with the lowest percentage between 5.0-5.99 will lose a qualifier-when multiple leagues are in that range. If no league is within those percentages the next league with the lowest percentage between 4.0-4.99 will lose a qualifier- when multiple leagues are in that range. If no league is within those percentages the next league with the lowest percentage between 3.0-3.99 will lose a qualifier.

4. In each weight-class, if open spots occur in the 29-person bracket, and after the alternate from the League which has the opening(s) has been placed, or is not available, then qualified alternates from other Leagues may be placed, in rank order (as determined by the Seeding Committee), in the open spot(s) to fill the 29- person bracket.
- C. When two [2] or more basic Leagues join together to form two [2] or more supplemental Leagues, the following shall apply:
1. When two [2] or more supplemental Leagues are formed by the joining of two [2] or more basic Leagues, and each of the two [2] or more basic Leagues had Automatic Qualifiers to the CCS Tournament, the new supplemental Leagues shall retain the total of their previous Automatic Qualifiers (e.g., League A and B each have three [3] Automatic Qualifiers. When the new supplemental Leagues are formed, combining A and B, they will have a total of six [6] Automatic Qualifiers).
 2. The League Board of Managers having governance authority over the supplemental Leagues shall determine in its bylaws how those Automatic Qualifiers will be allocated from the supplemental Leagues. In the absence of a basic League tournament to determine Section qualifiers, it MUST allocate an automatic berth to each of the supplemental League Champions

This proposal will change the seeding process from a subjective seeding process to an objective seeding process. The process will utilize returning section and state places along with current year results at various tournaments the wrestlers have placed in.

CURRENT LANGUAGE

SUBJECTIVE SEEDING

Section 5. SEEDING PROCEDURES AND AT-LARGE SELECTION PROCEDURES			
Up to six [6] individual wrestlers may be seeded by the Wrestling Committee and placed in brackets that correspond to their seeds. An alternate may also be designated for purposes of the following:			
1. If any of the top-six[6] seeds do not qualify (i.e., does not make weight, etc.) for the Tournament during the time following the seeding meeting but prior to the start of competition, then the seeding positions will be filled by moving seeded wrestlers up (e.g., if #4 does not make weight #5 goes to #4; #6 goes to #5), and the alternate will fill the last seeded position			
2. If all seeded wrestlers qualify for the Tournament, the alternate will remain in the general pool of qualifying wrestlers.			
The balance of the bracket will be filled by plan, while also achieving the following, whenever possible:			
1. Keep League Champions from meeting in the 1st Round; and			
2. Separate the 1st- and 2nd-Place entries from each League, by placing in opposite half-brackets.			
A League may have only one [1] wrestler on the board at any one time.			
The following required criteria will be used for seeding, in rank order:			
1.	Head-to-head;	4	Common opponents
2.	Returning CIF State meet medalist from previous year	5.	Tournament placing
3.	Returning CCS Meet medalist from previous year	6.	Overall record

A.	Up to six [6] individual wrestlers may be seeded by the Wrestling Committee and placed in brackets that correspond to their seeds in accordance with the following objective criteria																												
1.	<u>Each year at the CCS Wrestling Committee Evaluation meeting all relevant tournaments will be evaluated by their strength of their participants. The Committee will subjectively assign Tournament Factors (strength factors) that will be used in the seeding process for entries into the CCS championship the following year. (see Appendix A)</u>																												
2.	<u>Every athlete who is being considered for a seed must submit a completed Individual Seeding Form before the beginning of the seeding meeting.</u>																												
3.	<u>Every athlete who is being considered for a seed, will be seeded according to the number of points they have earned as submitted on the Individual Seeding Form as follows:</u>																												
	a.	Points for returning CIF/CCS places shall be applied as follows:

		i.	<u>If there is head to head competition between two wrestlers, the winner of the head-to-head competition will be the higher seed.</u>
		ii.	<u>If wrestlers are still tied, the wrestler with the highest place in the highest factored tournament will be the higher seed.</u>
		iii.	<u>If wrestlers are still tied, the wrestler with the higher place in the same factored tournament will be the higher seed.</u>
		iv.	<u>If wrestlers are still tied, the order of league finish will determine who will be the higher seed (i.e. Wrestler A finished 4th in his league, Wrestler B finished 2nd in his league, the 2nd place finisher will be the higher seed)</u>
		v.	<u>Common opponents will not be used to break ties. (ie. If wrestler A beat B, B beat C and then C beat A, this will not be used to break ties-the highest point total will be used to determine the seed)</u>

APPENDIX "A"
**CCS WRESTLING RANKING OF TOURNAMENTS
& OBJECTIVE INDIVIDUAL SEEDING FORM**

Ranking of Tournaments Process:

The ranking of tournaments will be subjectively evaluated by each member of the CCS Wrestling Advisory Committee. This process will be done at the end of each season and all evaluations need to be in the CCS Office a week before the CCS Evaluation Meeting.

- The committee will receive the listing of teams in each tournament that are being ranked
- The committee will receive individual brackets showing individuals that placed in the ranked tournament

The committee will rank each tournament and submit their results to the CCS Office which will compile the results and determine the factor for each tournament for the following year.

The subjective evaluation will be based on the following criteria:

1. Quality of teams in the tournament, based on past performances at invitationals, league, section, state tournaments.
2. Quality of individuals within each weight class at tournaments.

These factors will be applied to the Individual Seeding Form, that must be submitted for each wrestler who wishes to be considered for a seed.

Individual Seeding Form Process:

- The Individual Seeding Form must be filled out for each wrestler who would like to be considered for a seeded spot.
- Points are awarded to each individual wrestler based on their own finish in the top 4 tournaments in the current season in which they earned the most CCS seeding points.
- Points will also be awarded to the wrestlers place in the prior years CIF and /or CCS Tournaments.
- The current year top 4 tournament placings will be added to any returning CIF/CCS placings for a total Seeding points-which will be used in ranking the top 6 athletes.+ alternate.
- The wrestler must also include any current year head to head competition that may factor into the seeding process.
- The wrestler must also included the Overall Season Record
- Any ties in points will be broken in order of criteria set forth in Wrestling By law Section 5 A 3 (d).
